 - Lauri Pendred Evans City Elementary Principal
 - Bring Your Parent to Work Day Teachers and staff brought their parents to
 work today. Parents will observe their child teach and also talk to the students
 about what they did to help their child, who is now an educator, grow up to

 - Current Focus The principals are always reviewing testing data to help them
 address issues that are a weakness at Evans City Schools. They also are proud of
 their strengths. The data from standardized testing is color coded to know if
 there is growth at Evans City. All proficiency levels need to be higher so they are
 looking for the best answer.
 - Mandy Toy Evans City Middle School Principal
 - Evans City Middle School was the first to receive notebooks in the Seneca Valley School District for all of 5th and 6th grades. They have been working on getting them labeled and setup. Students are now using them in the classroom. There is a \$30 insurance fee for those students who would like to take theirs home after Thanksgiving Break. This fee will be waived for those in the free and reduced lunch program. The notebooks will be collected at the end of the year to get them ready for the next school year. They are still figuring out the best method of storing and charging them. They will be monitoring students to make sure of appropriate usage and there will be consequences for those who misuse them.
 - McKeever is officially closed. Lutherlyn has agreed to take the group (Zinkham / Rubaker) that did not get to go to McKeever due to a cancellation. They will go in November after the Thanksgiving Break. This will be a good time to see if Lutherlyn could be a permanent replacement for McKeever.
